"We started chatting, and I think it got to a point where he asked if I thought I was going to heaven. And I answered no," says Naz. "That's when we did a repentance prayer. And as soon as Tim touched my shoulder, I felt this incredible amount of energy surge throughout my body."

God used Tim and George, the church member who invited Naz to Body and Soul, to draw Naz to Jesus. But he also used the prayers of Christians like you!

There are over nine million people living in London, and half of them are unlikely to have a Christian friend – unlikely to ever hear the invitation of new life in Jesus.

But God is on the move! Missionaries are working alongside ordinary Christians to make connections with people around them, to share the gospel and to welcome people into God's family.

In the following pages, you'll meet:

- MISSIONARIES who specialise in ministry to a particular community (such people living on estates, or people from other religious background) working alongside churches to reach people with the gospel.
- MISSION ASSOCIATES (MA) who work alongside missionaries and churches in a supporting role.
- TEAM LEADERS who, as the name suggests, are missionaries who lead a team in a particular borough or ministry area.
- FIELD DIRECTORS missionaries who oversee LCM's gospel work in a region of London.
- PROJECT WORKERS who are based at one of LCM's homeless and marginalised ministries, coming alongside and supporting guests.
- PIONEERS are Christians who are being trained up for gospel outreach both in their local church, and alongside missionary teams.

PRAYING ACROSS WEST LONDON



HARISH PATEL, FIELD DIRECTOR, WEST LONDON

"West London is a great mission field with people from across the globe, especially the Indian subcontinent. As a Hindu-background believer myself, I feel at home in

this vibrant culture to share the good news of Jesus. Please pray with me as we seek to come alongside local churches, and together reach the south Asian community, along with many from other faiths."

Hounslow

Sometimes referred to as "Little Punjab". Many residents hold a strong identity in the Sikh or Muslim faith.



MANMOHAN SINGH, TEAM LDR.

"Every Friday afternoon we're out with a local church on Hounslow High Street. I estimate we engage in about ten meaningful conversations every month, and many

stay connected, welcoming follow-up conversations. I meet many from the Sikh community, so please pray for connections with Sikh-background Christians who can join us in this ministry."



JOSH COLLIS, MISSIONARY

"We've recently been encouraging the youth at Bethany church Southall to share Jesus with their friends, and many have been enthusiastic – some even signing

up for an extra online Bible course. The students have been particularly successful in initiating faith conversations with Muslim students. Pray that we may continue to equip and encourage the church in this wonderful gospel outreach."

Harrow

There are 255,000 people in Harrow, and 100 churches. If each church reached out to 1,000 people with the gospel, then almost half the local population could hear about Jesus – a large percentage of the population are Hindu.



EMMANUEL GILL, TEAM LDR.

"I met Ally" at a recent outreach event who was interested in a tract, "Death Defeated." It prompted many questions about Jesus bringing the little girl back to life in Mark 5:41,

and she eagerly accepted a copy of the New Testament. There are many Hindus like Ally in Harrow – more than any other London borough. Pray for us as we seek to reach them and to equip local Christians in this mission."



JOSPEH PANDIAN, MISSIONARY

"Please pray for people attending the Tamil-speaking church we've been supporting on Fridays – Patrick who we met through the coffee morning; two Hindu students;

a Hindu couple who came to our Christmas outreach and asked me to pray for their family; several Hindu students from Brunel University who attended the Christmas events. May the gospel transform their hearts."

Kensington

Often seen as a wealthy area but many people are struggling. We regularly meet people from the Arabic community and are building relationships through English language classes, door-to-door ministry and street evangelism.



PATRICK KANGI, TEAM LDR.

"On his first day visiting local residents, church member Andrew* was nervous but he wanted to put the LCM training into practice. That morning, we met James*

who was very open to the gospel, and a conversation later wanted to accept Jesus as Lord! This really encouraged Andrew and they are now meeting for 1-1 discipleship. Pray for James' faith to grow, and for more Christians like Andrew to step out in faith."



HALEH, MISSIONARY

"God is doing amazing things among the Iranian community, but spiritual growth is slow. There are plenty of opportunities to meet spiritual needs, prayer,

and deliverance. We especially desire to initiate more personal, one-toone meetings. Pray for courage to keep stepping out in bold faith with the church"





SISTER BASMA, MISSIONARY

"God is working in a remarkable way among Iranians in London. Recently an Iranian lady joined a seekers' course run by a church we're supporting. "Is Jesus

God's son, or God?" she asked. She seemed amazed when I showed her John 10:30 "I and the Father are one"... "Did Jesus die for my sins?" She asked with wide eyes. Pray for her to continue with the course and come to know Jesus as her saviour."

Brent

Home of Wembley, and the famous stadium, the borough is the second most diverse in London. Residents are more likely to follow a religion than almost anywhere else in the UK.



MARÍNA AKINJIOLA, TEAM LDR.

"Sarah* from a local church I've been coming alongside, has been struggling with self-worth and purpose. She feels let down by many in her life, especially men. As we have

studied the Bible together, she has become confident in her Christian identity, has begun sharing her faith with others and is willing to pray with people in need. Please pray for her and for more opportunities to encourage these young people in their faith and evangelism."

PRAYING ACROSS NORTH LONDON



CHARLOTTE MAYHEW, FIELD DIRECTOR

"On her first visit to our church, the mother of a displaced Turkish family, said she didn't want to talk about religion. Now, she wants people to answer her

questions about who Jesus is and how to follow him. We believe God has brought a global Church to north London to reach this city. Let's pray that God would help us to make the most of this strategic gospel opportunity!"

Camden

Despite Camden being the borough of choice for the rich and famous, there is a huge population of refugees, asylum seekers and those who find themselves homeless.



JILL PURSLOW, TEAM LDR.

"Please pray for Euston Church's homeless ministry. Camden has the second highest number of those sleeping rough in London, so every Sunday we go out visiting those

on the streets and invite them to join the church's drop in sessions. We praise God that two people who attended our 'warm space' ministry have decided to join a Bible study group at the church."



AMANDA-LEE CHILI, MISSIONARY

"We saw God at work when LCM and the Church were able to collaborate with homeless services to help a young Romanian man who needs a heart transplant,

in a way that reflected God's mercy and kindness towards him and his family. He thanked us and said, "I trust you, God is great, maybe he will save me". Please pray for him to continue to trust Jesus and to receive the urgent medical treatment that he needs."



PETRA ZIMMERMANN, MISSIONARY

"We go out with the local church in Westminster to visit nearby sleep sites, and we are seeing an increasing number living on the streets. Recently a church

member had the privilege of reading a Psalm with a woman and her husband who were homeless. They were delighted to discover that we were with the church. Pray for more gospel encounters with those in desperate need of a saviour."

Islington

The Caledonian Road in Islington divides affluent Barnsbury from the Bemerton Estate, where LCM has been sharing the gospel for many years.



ANDREW BARNETT, TEAM LDR.

"We want the community to see that the church here cares about them. We've been meeting a woman in her eighties with a Jehovah's Witness background, and

she's responded with so much interest as we've read the Bible together. Pray for friendships like these to develop, and that we'd see people giving their lives to Jesus "

DAADA LUOGON, TEAM LDR.

"I'm passionate to work with the diverse communities here in London.

I often find that diaspora churches (made up of people who identify with another part of the world) are enthusiastic about prayer, evangelism and preaching the gospel. Because of own their struggles arriving in a new culture, they are passionate about depending on God. Pray for our work with these churches that we would encourage them to reach this global city."

Hackney

In amongst the up-and-coming neighourhoods which Hackney has become famous for, are pockets of communities largely unreached by the gospel.



JAMES TREDGETT. TEAM LDR.

 "We recently met an elderly lady, living on a church's local estate. She has been experiencing some very significant families issues, and is confined

her to the lounge where she sleeps and eats. She was so happy to see us and receive prayer as we shared the gospel with her! The church has since visited her for 1-1 Bible studies. Pray for her salvation and that God would touch her son's life."



REBECCA TORTELLI, MISSIONARY

"In Hackney, amongst the affluent, trendy neighbourhoods, there are also youngsters battling with identity, hostels housing people who

are displaced with nowhere to go, and many communities seeking hope in Islam and other religions apart from Christ. Please pray for me, starting in my role at LCM, to get to know the local churches so I can understand how to best serve and equip them to reach the community."



MAEGAN WEBB, PIONEER

"I'm supporting a local church's Mums and Tots outreach ministry, and I've already had some great conversations. Isla*, who struggles with anxiety and

past trauma allowed me to pray for her and she accepted a Bible. She has since told me that she feels much more positive and less afraid. Pray for this relationship to develop and for more opportunities to share the hope of the gospel with her."



The borough is home to a growing Turkish community, initially with Cypriot Turks arriving in the 1960s, later from the mainland, and more recently from countries such as Bulgaria. Turkish is the borough's second most spoken language after English.





NIMO. TEAM LDR.

"It is a joy each week to see a growing number of the Turkish-speaking Muslim students waiting patiently for the Al Massira study to start - an evangelistic

course that journeys through the Old Testament prophets to meet the Messiah. Please pray for it to bear much fruit and would ripple outwards reaching the 62.380 Muslims that live here in Enfield."





MARAT KURBANOV, MISSIONARY

"Pray for the six churches we're working with in Enfield, particularly the English classes that help us reach people in the community with the gospel. In

Autumn last year one class went from one regular student to 12! The volunteers truly want to see the students succeed in their life in the UK, and it's a great way to connect with people and demonstrate the love of Christ on a weekly basis."



RAYNA STOYANOVA, PIONEER

"As a team, we are working together to bring the good news of Jesus to the Turkish community in London. I can count 20 people I know that are

very open to the gospel! Please pray for us as we come alongside the local churches to teach them about Jesus. Pray particularly for Edie*, a woman I am currently studying the Bible with who has many questions."

Haringey

Haringey has a disparity between more affluent areas such as Muswell Hill, and the North East where there are pockets of communities especially unlikely to otherwise hear the gospel.



ADAM BOYCE, TEAM LDR.

"We've been training a number of churches across the borough in getting out into their neighbourhoods and sharing the gospel - one church has an eight-

strong team who have had over 150 gospel conversations. They're on a roll, and training other people in the church to do the same so they can cover more ground! Please pray for this momentum to continue!"



DANIEL OLTEANU, MISSIONARY

A lot of people tell me they don't have the confidence to go out and talk to people about Jesus on their doorsteps. But I tell them just start

by watching me. It's amazing to see Elim, from St Cuthbert's church, stepping out from his comfort zone. Elim now says 'I can't stop speaking about Jesus.' Please pray God would do the same work in many more hearts of Christians here."



JOHANNA BRISCOE, MISSIONARY

"We have seen repeat visitors come along to the weekly book-table ministry. Gordon*, a Jehovah's Witness, has been attending and asking questions

for almost two months. After several Bible studies with him he has been open to receive prayer and said he felt "challenged in some of

his thinking." Please pray that God would open his heart to receive and understand Jesus as his personal saviour."

PRAYING ACROSS EAST LONDON





GARETH JONES, FIELD DIRECTOR, EAST LONDON

"'I learnt so much,' said Pat* after she attended an LCM training course on how to reach Muslim neighbours with the love of Jesus. Now her and the LCM team are

working together to run a course for Muslim seekers across east London. She's already thinking about people she can invite. Pray for us as we pilot this course soon, and that Pat would continue to grow in confidence."



Dagenham is home to the Becontree estate – the largest of its kind in Europe. LCM has been ministering to residents alongside local churches.





YORDAN SOTIROV, TEAM LDR.

"We're currently supporting a local church to expand their food project to include an element of gospel outreach. Those receiving a free lunch are glad to

get to know us as we befriend them and seek to share Jesus. Some have expressed an interest to come along to Bible Study. Pray for this church as they expand this ministry and that many would come to know Christ through it."



SALOME FIALHO RODRIGUES, MISSIONARY

"Since opening a food pantry with a local Dagenham church in 2022, we have been able to help 132 families, and I have seen the volunteers grow in

confidence to build relationships and share the gospel. A regular client joined a seekers' course to explore faith and we often have great chats about God. Please pray with us to meet many more like her in need of not just physical provision, but the hope of Jesus."



JAYNE KINGHORN, MISSIONARY

"I was so encouraged when Adaku* from one of our partner churches signed up for LCM's Muslim Engagement Training. It's encouraged her to speak

confidently about her faith in her workplace – she shared her faith with a Muslim colleague which then sparked a wider conversation with her other colleagues. She'd always been mission-minded, but she didn't have an outlet for it. Please pray we'd equip and embolden more Christians like Adaku."



SHAUN RILEY, MA

"Alongside South Park Chapel, we've been reaching out to the community in Ilford through a coffee morning ministry. It's open for all ages, offering tea

and cake as well as arts and crafts with a Bible study that follows. It's a great way to meet local residents. Please pray for us to support the church well, and that through this ministry we would be able to bring the gospel to many."



ANDREW SIMPSON, MA

"My work focuses on reaching out to seniors in the community, as many struggle with loneliness. As I support the church's café offering a place of

welcome, friendship and a hot drink, I meet many in need of Jesus. Please pray for lasting relationships to be built so that people would have the chance to hear and respond to the gospel."

O Newham & Redbridge

Newham is one of the most populated and ethnically diverse boroughs in London and has one of the highest Muslim populations across the city. It also has some of the highest levels of poverty and physical need in the city – one of the ministries LCM runs is building connections with women who have been victims of abuse and trafficking. LCM is also increasingly working with churches in neighbouring Redbridge.



KAY, TEAM LDR.

"Salma* came to Christ before the pandemic hit, but she now lives in a Muslim country and needs support and discipleship. I recently passed on my ministry

of reading the Bible 1-1 with her to a church member and they now regularly meet over zoom. Praise God for this friendship, and pray that Salma would be encouraged to keep going with Jesus, standing firm in her faith "



ILYAS AYOUB. MISSIONARY

"Alongside local churches, we've been supporting the community through food banks and drop-in centres for those that need help with accommodation. I

was able to train a church volunteer in reaching Muslims at their food pantry, and he has really grown in confidence. We have seen Muslims come to Christ! Please pray for those we meet that they wouldn't just be helped with physical needs, but come to know Jesus."



FAITH EDWARDS, MISSIONARY

"Praise God for many coming to the 'Community Space', we helped to set up in a local east London. church, providing hot food and a space to relax

and build friendships. Some guests struggle with addiction or homelessness, but recently many have started to come to church on Sunday with some professing faith in Christ! Pray for us as we run training on engaging with different cultures. May the team grow in confidence as they serve practically and spiritually."

"I have the privilege of training and supporting church members in ministry. One particular lady has been telling me how she's excited to learn more

in the Bible studies we've been doing together. She asks for prayer to stay receptive and to grow in knowledge and patience. Please pray for me too as I navigate my first year on the Pioneer programme – learning and growing in gospel ministry."

Tower Hamlets

In parts of Tower Hamlets, like Whitechapel, you can feel you've been transported to the subcontinent. Bangladeshis account for a third of the borough's residents. It's also a challenging place for young people in many areas, with the high child poverty rate in the country.



MATT BRINKLEY, MISSIONARY TEAM LEADER

"Terry" who I met in the local community was telling me how he likes the idea of following Jesus and has a picture of him on his wall at home. But

I challenged him that following Jesus means doing what he says. including loving your enemies – a difficult thing for him to accept because of a painful past. Pray his heart softens to know, love and follow the true person of Jesus."





MARLENE BOTHA, MISSIONARY

"In October we supported a small local church to launch a children's holiday club, which 35 children from the community with no previous church links

attended. About half of these came from Muslim or Hindu families. and all heard a clear gospel message. I was encouraged by 27 of the church's 40 members who made this project happen. Pray for God to bless their efforts and for gospel seeds planted to take root."






SELAM ABRAHA, MISSIONARY

"I've been going with a group from a local church into a nearby housing project. As we build relationships we are aware of various people's needs that only the

Lord can meet. We have started a Bible study but sometimes people need to talk one-to-one and we have to be ready for that. Pray that my faith wouldn't be in human wisdom but in God's power."



MARK GOODBODY, MA

"A Bible study we recently launched alongside a local church is booming! I can see God working powerfully in this space as some days it's difficult to

accommodate all the people that attend, hungry to learn more about God's word. Pray for one of our regulars who is a Muslim – he diligently attends, listens and is seeking answers."

"A mother and her children from the local estate have been coming to the 'socials' I've been supporting my local church to host. She now regularly comes

KEVIN CROFT, FIELD DIRECTOR SOUTH LONDON

"There's a need for us to knock on people's doors, as often they are not knocking on our churches' doors. Over 50% of our church relationships have

ministries visiting their local estates, so I am helping to develop a much-needed door-ministry resource, to train up churches in this ministry. Please pray that these new resources will be a blessing to many churches in south London and beyond."

Lewisham

A melting pot of cultures, ways of life and worldviews - there's a big arts scene in the north of the borough because of the university there, which exists alongside working-class communities.

"Cate*, a local church member who we support to run a fitness session and Bible study for women shared, "the ladies are asking more questions and

there is a growing sense of friendship. I encouraged them to pray 'God. even though I don't believe in you, please reveal yourself to me.' Pray for Cate in this ministry where many are hearing about Jesus for the first time. May each one come to a saving faith in him."



MATT LOFTHOUSE, MISSIONARY

"I've really seen Jodie* grow in her passion for evangelism and equipping other believers. She heard about our work with another church and wanted to

come and help there, so we encouraged and equipped her to help lead the Bible study. It's been amazing to see churches working together as we've come alongside Jodie to resource and equip others! Pray for these effects to ripple outwards to more Christians in Lewisham."

Parts of Southwark, such as Bermondsey and Rotherhithe are primarily white working class – it's Millwall FC territory. Here there's typically less exposure to the church and to the gospel. You cross the Old Kent Road and it's a completely different story – with a wealth of churches, especially representing African communities.
